Treasurer's Report (Clint Snider)

The club's balance as of May 2, 2019: \$16,754.17

Some of our regular expenses include:

Waste Management is about \$127 per month Electric bill is about \$80 per month Verizon is \$55 per month Business insurance is \$300 per year

We recently made purchases for the VBA shoot at Home Depot and Costco (food supplies). We issued a \$300 check to VBA to cover the membership fees of new NORVA members.

At the May meeting, Treasurer Snider stated that he would like to keep a financial buffer of about \$5,000 in the club account in anticipation of an accountant's audit and any possible tax liability.

At the May meeting a motion was made to allot \$4,000 for the purchase of new 3-D targets. It was unanimously approved. This should cover the purchase of up to 7 new targets. Five would be for use, and the other two would be spares. The amount should also cover the cost of inserts.

The plan is to increase the 3-D range from 25 to 30 targets. We would keep the same lanes, but double up 5 lanes (i.e., have two targets at five lanes).

Jeff Van de Vaarst had some suggestions for the new targets:

•A new 4-foot black bear •A gazelle

•Insert for cinnamon bear •A new alligator

•A havalena. •A skunk and a badger

•A Tom to be paired with the strutting turkey

•A snowshoe hare for the cat •A corsican ram

VBA Issues

At the May NORVA Meeting there was a continuation of the discussion about changing the VBA zones. Rodney Roberts talked to Dave at Cub Run and Larry from Belvoir Bowhunters about this issue. He proposed moving Manahoac and Prince William to a different zone than ours. Dave of Cub Run agreed. Larry of Belvoir needs to put it out for a vote (during their meeting in mid-May).

Rodney is drafting a letter for the VBA on this issue. Clint Snieder suggested that the three club presidents should sign it and send it to Bakari (the VBA Field VP).

The VBA will have a new president, now that Bob Foster has moved to Texas. We wish him well. The next VBA meeting is in June.

Hunting Information

<u>Fairfax County Park Hunts</u> -- The qualification process is under way. You have until the end of the month to do it. Remember that this is now a yearly requirement. You have to use the actual broadhead that you hunt with; you are no longer able to use practice heads. Also, the price has gone up to \$10 per try. Once the qualification process is closed, you will need to do the online application process.

<u>International Bowhunter Education Program (IBEP)</u> – This class is required to archery hunt the Fairfax county park program as well as on Fort Belvoir. There are multiple places to attend this course. They generally run about 8 hours and are conducting mostly on Saturdays. See link below to find a class in your area. You only need to take this class once (good for life).
