### Message from the Board

As required in Article 4, Section 9 of NORVA's by-laws, this Newsletter is a report to the membership of the Board's actions. It also constitutes the minutes from the August meeting.

### Message from the President (Joe Wolfe)

President Wolfe lead the August meeting. The following topics were discussed.

<u>Club's Insurance Policy</u>. President Wolfe informed the club that the club's insurance policy was coming up for renewal. It was scheduled to expire on August 11. Its coverage includes:

General Liability: \$1,000,000 per occurrence; \$3,000,000 aggregate; \$50,000 per accident Directors and Officers Liability: \$1,000,000 Crime: \$25,000 Equipment: \$3,000

The policy provides coverage for club-sponsored events with up to 300 participants. President Wolfe explained that without a policy the Occoquan Regional Park would not allow NORVA to operate.

The fee to renew for another year is \$2,445.35. There was a motion to renew the policy. It passed unanimously.

<u>Federal tax-exempt status for NORVA</u>. President Wolfe presented an IRS information sheet on how social and recreational clubs can attain tax-exempt status under IRC 501(c)(7). The initial submission to request this status is significant. Once the club is granted this status, however, subsequent filing for renewal will be much less onerous. President Wolfe opined that the club meets the criteria to be granted this status.

Once the club obtains non-profit status under this provision, it will receive a certification to that effect. This certification will allow the club to be exempted from sales taxes on its purchases.

<u>Club audit</u>. President Wolfe informed that an audit of the club by a certified accountant would cost between \$3,000 to \$5,000. A less expensive option would be to ask five club members (chosen at random) to do a review of the club's finances and provide a financial report back to the club. This review would go back three years. The club will need to submit an audit or a financial report to the IRS as part of its request for tax-exempt status.

There was a discussion of the options to obtain a report. They were:

- 1. Contract a certified accountant to do an audit.
- 2. Find a certified accountant who would do the audit for us for free.
- 3. Ask a group of five club members (chosen at random) to do a review of our finances for the last three years. This group would provide a financial report back to the club.

There was a vote. Option 3 passed unanimously.

<u>Membership update</u>. President Wolfe reported that the club was up to 344 members. Our VBA dues are paid up. He commended Membership Chair Gerry Petraitis for the great job he does in the new-member orientation. It appears that the club may hit 400 members this year.

There was a question as to the number of club members over the last few years. President Wolfe stated that he would check.

New Business: Club Mailing Address.

NORVA has had the same mailing address as the Occoquan Regional Park. We now have a Post Office Box. Thus, our address is:

New Business: Nominees for the 2020 Board of Directors

President Wolfe informed that Vice President McKenzie and Treasurer Snider both were stepping down.

Preliminary nominations were made. Joe Wolfe was nominated for President. He indicated that he wanted time to think about this before accepting a nomination for another term.

Chris Foster was nominated for Vice President. He accepted the nomination.

This will be voted on at the September meeting.

New Issue: Visit from Occoquan Regional Park Manager Lance Elzie

Mr. Lance Elzie, the new park manager, addressed the club. He stated that he was still learning what were the respective responsibilities of the Club and the Park.

President Wolfe mentioned that mountain bikers occasionally come onto the Club property. Mr. Elzie asked that club members notify park authorities when things like that happen.

Vice President McKenzie asked that the Park inform the Club when activities such as GPS Marathons are held on the rest of the property. He agreed to do so.

#### Message from the Vice President (John McKenzie)

Vice President McKenzie discussed the need for clubhouse maintenance. The facia board is rotting out. Also, the French drain in front of the clubhouse is clogged on one side. John Hoffman stated that he would bring a snake to unclog it.

#### Web Master Report (Uwe Jacobs)

Web Master Jacobs reported that the website is operating well.

### 3-D Course Range Captain (Willy Whitlock)

Captain Whitlock discussed repairs that were needed on the ranges.

- •Putting up a fence section for the 60-yard target.
- •Repairing the 40-yard target on the practice range.

He had a list of materials needed for this work. This work was done at the Club Work Party held on August 3.

At the meeting Captain Whitlock reported that the 3-D range was in good shape. We now have 30 targets on 25 shooting lanes. He is working on updating the signs to reflect the increase in the number of targets.

**NEW RULE for the 3-D Range:** Please do not step on the 3-D tassel stakes. Put your foot against them – like you are propping the tassels up. This will prolong the life of the tassels.
