VBA Affiliation

There was a general discussion regarding a proposal that NORVA end its affiliation with the Virginia Bowhunters Association. A petition that listed a number of reasons for ending the affiliation was presented. The reasons included the following:

•The VBA is not recognized by any other state or national archery organization.

•The VBA is planning to increase fees for state shoots in 2022.

•The VBA has not managed its finances well.

•The VBA has not been transparent enough with regard to documenting or sharing information on the proceedings of its meetings.

•The funds that NORVA pays to the VBA could be spent on improving NORVA facilities.

•Some NORVA members do not wish to pay part of their dues for lobbying on bowhunter issues.

Five members signed the petition. This number is sufficient to bring the matter to a vote. A copy of the petition (with the five signatures) has been posted to the club's Facebook page.

This issue will be voted on at NORVA's September meeting (which will be held on September 9).

Membership Chair (Gerry Petraitis)

As of the August monthly club meeting, we had 581 members. Following the August new member orientation that was held on August 15, the club is not up to 606 members. This is the club's highest number ever.

3-D Range Captain (Reggie Atkins)

We are still waiting for the 3-D targets that the club ordered a while ago. The pandemic has adversely affected the supply chain, and deliveries are delayed.

Reggie will be swapping out animals if he doesn't receive the inserts needed. Also, he is working on an uphill shot.

Field Course (Ken Wilkinson)

Ken reported that he plans to add new targets. As the weather cools down, he will add new blocks to the targets.

Events Chair (Celeste Otsuka)

We have a winner for our logo re-design contest! There were many great submissions, but after two rounds of voting and one round of consideration by the Board, the below logo has been selected.

VBA Representative (Bakari Dale)

Bakari reported on two agenda items that will be considered at the next VBA meeting:

1. A proposal to raise the cost of state shoots from \$20 to \$30 for members, with a maximum charge of \$60 per family. For non-VBA members, the charge would go up from \$20 to \$40.

At the August NORVA meeting, those present voted unanimously that NORVA should vote "No" on this initiative.

2. A proposal to add "Barebow Recurve" as a shooting category for students. At the August NORVA, those present voted unanimously (with 4 abstaining) that NORVA should vote "Yes" on this initiative.

Tournament Chair

Rodney Roberts has left Northern Virginia. Thus we are in dire need of someone to replace him as Tournament Chair.

Treasurer's Report (John Shea)

John reported that the club took in approximately \$2,500 in July. The big expenditure for July was \$4,565 for the club's insurance policy.

We have a projected year-end balance of \$11,374. This amount includes an emergency reserve of \$10,000. The July 2021 checking account report appears below.

Signing in at NORVA

When visiting NORVA, you must sign in via the electronic sign-in form (https://www.novaarchers.org/signin.html). Guests need to sign the liability waiver at (https://www.novaarchers.org/guest_waiver.html) once per calendar year. Hunting Information

Fairfax County Park Hunts (see <u>https://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/wildlife/archery-program</u>): Qualifications for the next season will run from April 1 – July 2 and must be done on an annual basis. Qualification sessions will be held at NORVA. Check the webpage as well as the Facebook page for the schedule.

International Bowhunter Education Program (IBEP) – This class is required to archery hunt the Fairfax county park program as well as on Fort Belvoir. There are multiple places to attend this course. They generally run about 8 hours and are conducted mostly on Saturdays. See https://register-ed.com/programs/virginia/66-virginia-bowhunter-education-course-ibep/agency to find a class in your area. In case there are no more seats available, contact Sgt. Earit Powell at Earit.Powell@fairfaxcounty.gov to get into one of his classes. You only need to take this class once (good for life) as long as you can produce the IBEP card.

Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries app for your phone. Now you can notch your deer tag without the paper tag and without calling the 800-number to report it. The APP can hold multiple digital licenses so you don't need to carry paper ones or deer tags.
