Message from the Board

As required in NORVA's by-laws, this Newsletter is a report to the membership of the Board's actions. It also constitutes the minutes from the April 2022 meeting.

General Items

The April 2022 meeting was held on-line. It was led by club President Joe Wolfe

Storage Area

There was continued discussion on how the club could obtain more storage space. Possibilities included (1) a shipping container, (2) a pre-fab building, and (3) building a structure off the back of the academy or club sheds. Ken and Jordan will come up with an estimate of the cost of materials to build something off the back of the club's current sheds.

Facility upkeep

More gravel is needed for the 60-yard practice lane and as backfill for the old outhouse. John will come up with estimates. We are also working on installing covers for the practice range and Academy range.

IBEP-Certified instructors

Joe indicated that he would like the club to have a cadre of instructors certified by the International Bowhunter Education Program.

By-laws revision

Uwe asked about revising the club's by-laws to, among other things, remove reference to the VBA, now that the club is no longer part of that organization. Jim will start the project of considering that and other possible changes. John has suggestions for that project.

3-D Range (Reggie Atkins)

As projects for the 3-D Range, Reggie will be working on replacing bow-hangers. Also, he would like to add benches on the course as well. He and Jordan Faircloth will work on a design for the benches

Field Course (Ken Wilkinson)

Upcoming projects for the field course include replacing bow-hangers and repairing the number 14 target stand.

Events (Celeste Otsuka)

John suggested that we put in a new order for club caps, this time with a camouflage or khaki background.

Membership (Gerry Petraitis)

There were 25 people at the new member orientation that was held in April. The club now has 592 members.

Tournaments (Susan Erdos)

The Club's first shoot of the year was held on April 2. There were 34 participants. Their scores were posted on the club's web page.

Our next shoot will be the "Spring Fling" Field, Hunter, and 3-D Pin shoot on May 21.

Treasurer's Report (John Shea)
